Though this book assembles a lot of material, most of it from Pali literature, both author and printer are so inaccurate that x it is virtually worthless. The comments are generally fatuous. The standard works on this subject remain B.C.Law's Women in Buddhist Literature and Miss I.B.Horner's Women under Primitive Buddhism; both are listed in the bibliography, the former even twice.
